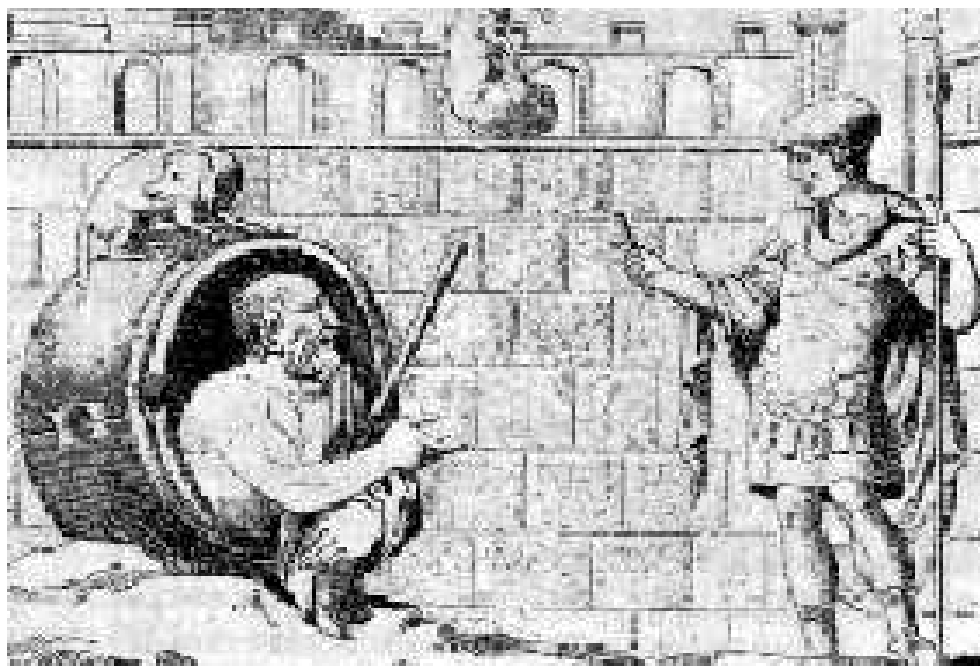

## ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

**Beginning at 10am, 28<sup>th</sup> February - ending at 3 pm, 1<sup>st</sup> March**



In the **seria of workshops** organized by Psycho-Social Section GAS-Belgrade with Consulting-Art Belgrade developing the psycho-social field in our **Learning Community** – year **2015 will start** with the OPUS ‘**International Listening Posts**’ workshop on 10<sup>th</sup> January (in Serbian), ‘**Organizational Role Analysis**’ workshop on 7<sup>th</sup> February (in Serbian), and this - ‘**Home, Homelessness, and Community**’ workshop on 28<sup>th</sup> Febr-1<sup>st</sup> March (in English, and Serbian).

Convenors **Christopher Scanlon** and **Marina Mojovic**, both having practiced in the fields of **Group Analysis, Group Relations, Therapeutic Community, and Psycho-Social Studies**, over the years had often reflected on co-creating spaces for dialogue between these professional fields in theory and practice – discussions, which often encountered themes of psycho-social homelessness and liminal spaces.

## ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

Beginning at 10am, 28<sup>th</sup> February - ending at 3 pm, 1<sup>st</sup> March



**The aim of this workshop** is to explore the meaning of **home** and **community** through in-depth consideration of the experience, and the meaning, of *homelessness* and '*unhoused states of mind*'.

This **one-and-a-half-day co-operative inquiry workshop** will comprise a combination of talks and **small and large groups** for further **in-depth discussion** and exploration and will include an **experiential role-play exercise**.

We will begin by considering the difficulties of working with hard-to-reach homeless persons whose membership of society is defined by their placing of themselves in *liminal spaces* that are neither in nor out and how this is linked to other more ordinary '*unhoused states of mind*'. This will be followed by discussion and exploration of the meaning, and our experience, of '**community**' and the potential contribution of this concept to personal, social and spiritual health as well as a consideration of the pain caused when communities become corrupted, divided, damaged or fail.

The convenors are particularly interested in providing a **reflective space**, which can facilitate **conversations between people with a wide range of personal experience, differing social backgrounds, and professional disciplines**.

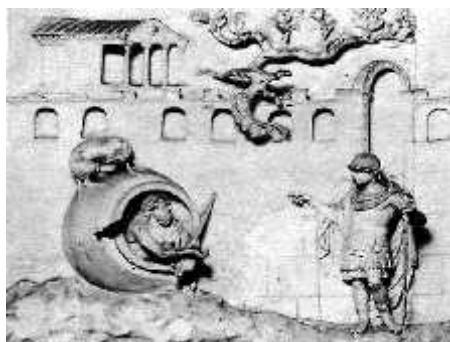
## WORKSHOP CONVENORS



**Christopher Scanlon**, MSc. DPhil Consultant Psychotherapist in general adult and forensic mental health in the NHS in London; Training Group Analyst and member of Faculty at *Institute of Group Analysis (IGA)* and Visiting professor Psychosocial Practice, University of East London. He is also Founder member of the *Association for Psychosocial Studies (APS)*; associate member of *Organisation for Promotion of the Understanding of Society (OPUS)* and member of the *International Society for the Psychoanalytic Study of Society (ISPSO)*.



**Marina Mojovi** , MA, MD, psychiatrist, psychoanalytic psychotherapist, group analyst, organizational consultant in Serbia. She is a full member of the Group Analytic Society International, of the International Association for Group Psychotherapy and Group Processes, of the European Society of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy, the International Society for Psychoanalytic Studies of Organizations, and the Organization for Promoting Understanding of Society. In Group Analytic Society-Belgrade she is a training group analyst, supervisor and the founder of its Section and Training in '*Psychoanalytic and Group Analytic Approach to Understanding Institutions, Organizations and Society*'. She develops the Serbian Reflective Citizens Project, and other projects of exploring the Social Unconscious in Serbia and abroad.
